Summer is here and that means hot days ahead. Anyone can be affected by the heat of the summer sun, but the elderly are especially vulnerable. To stay safe this summer, follow these safety tips:

- Stay inside during the hottest hours of the day. These hours are usually from mid morning to mid afternoon.
- Dress lightly and when sleeping use light-weight, breathable covers.
- Drink plenty of water and other fluids.
- Use a fan to keep air circulating.
- Never leave anyone in the car while you run to do a quick errand.
- Keep blinds closed in the morning to escape the direct heat from sunlight.
- If you must go outside, try to do it during the early morning hours or the later in the evening.

Summer can be a fun time of year as long as you keep safety in mind. Overheating during the hot summer months can be dangerous, so use common sense to ensure a good time for the whole family!
